

1. Initial Preparation

Prepare a clean and accessible working environment with suitable access and sufficient working space. Inspect and double check all materials prior to commencing work to ensure no issues once building is underway.

2. Wall Preparation

The Z-Tile panels require a suitable backing material for proper adhesion. Due to the panel weights, we recommend adhering to either concrete blockwork or a suitable construction / cement board. The surface to be clad should be clean, level and structurally sound.

3. Setting Out

It is always advisable to fully set out your cladding before installation. This can be carried out using a string line and chalk, and will enable you to spot any issues and make any adjustments to the setting out before you start installing your cladding; this is especially important for irregular areas where specific cuts may be required.

4. Installing the Z-Tile System

Each stone should be cleaned with a sponge and clean water to remove any dust or loose material prior to fixing. This will help prevent poor bonding to the base material. Apply a suitable cladding adhesive to the wall to be clad and to the back of the cladding panel using a notched trowel, giving full coverage of the back of the panel (not spot bedded). Offer the panel up to the wall and slide into place to ensure no voids are present behind the panel and that full adhesive coverage is achieved.

Check that each panel is level and adjust as required. Repeat this process for each panel.

The Z-Tile system is designed so that each of the panels interlocks for easy coursing and installation. Only minimal cutting should be required to suit irregular heights, details or runs, with the majority of the cladding requiring no/minimal cutting or alteration.

5. Cutting

Any cutting required should be carried out using a suitable, water suppressed tile saw. Different stones require different blades for cutting, and it is important to ensure that the correct blade is used to avoid damaging your stone and to give the best finish.

6. Protecting Your Cladding as you Build

It is important to keep your cladding protected and clean as you build. Clean off any mortar/adhesive splashes straight away, and keep your cladding protected from the elements to avoid mortar/adhesive failure due to curing too quickly or drying out. Follow the mortar/adhesive manufacturer's instructions regarding minimum/maximum temperatures for building (generally building should not be undertaken at temperatures below 3 degrees Celsius).

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
